"Sue was a member of the Pediatric Readiness Resource
Development Working Group and brought with her many of the
resources she had used in HCA hospitals to improve pediatric
readiness," said Dr. Marianne Gausche-Hill, Director of Emergency
Medical Services and Director of the EMS and Pediatric Emergency
Medicine Fellowships at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. "She was a
true "thought leader" for her time. Sue provided the leadership to the
165 HCA hospitals including model policies and procedures for
children, quality improvement and disaster plans for children,
processes to allow for exchange of equipment between low and high
volume hospitals to improve equipment availability for children, and
assigning roles of physician and nurse coordinator for pediatric
emergency care. With these interventions she was able to improve
the pediatric readiness of these hospitals in 20 states including
Tennessee."

Dr. Joseph Weinberg, after whom the leadership award is named, was an instrumental figure in the establishment of Emergency Medical Services for Children both nationally and in Tennessee. He was one of the original authors of the first publication noting the deficiencies of the healthcare system as it relates to critically ill and injured children. He is the ideal embodiment of a pediatrician that combines his expertise in emergency medicine and political maneuvering to improve care for children.
