One Easter Sunday, April 4, Andrew Hopkins' was being driven to the hospital when he complained of severe chest pain. On the way, Mr. Hopkins lost consciousness; luckily, he was right in front Cheatham County EMS's station. Paramedics worked quickly to stabilize him and called Vanderbilt LifeFlight to transport him to Centennial Medical Center. In flight, Mr. Hopkins suffered another cardiac episode and was revived by the LifeFlight crew after 18 shocks to his heart. He was released from the hospital after only six days.
